Principal's Message:

Welcome back everyone. I hope all of you had a fun holiday with your family. The December holiday is always busy for parents, but hopefully you had a change, if not a rest!

Last month we enjoyed seeing our families at the holiday concerts and we thank the staff and students for putting on such a fun show. We also need to thank our breakfast program, School Council and St. John's Church (Ida) volunteers for organizing and preparing the wonderful turkey dinner we had before the holidays. We also want to thank our families for generously donating food items and toys. These were gratefully received by Millbrook Food Share and by our local Legion. Thank you everyone!



In December, Mr. Heuvel helped us borrow the huge floor map of Canada you see in the picture. Our students had fun walking all over Canada to find important Geographic places and environmental treasures unique to our beautiful country.

On Wednesday last week both our Superintendent (Mr. Mangold) and the Director of Education (Dr. LeClerc) spent the morning touring our school and hearing first hand from the kids and staff about all the interesting things they are learning at school. A highlight for our director was making a video with Adelaide C. (Gr. 6) and Dylan D. (Gr. 5) who are

this year's co-chairs of our OPHEA Committee. OPHEA stands for the Ontario Physical and Health Educators' Association. Last year our school applied for and met the criteria for gold certification as an official 'OPHEA Healthy School'. Six schools in our board obtained healthy school certification last year and only two obtained gold certification. The Director's video will highlight this success so it can be shared with staff at all KPR schools. In the video, Adelaide and Dylan talk about the work of the committee last year and the goals for this year. They mention how we worked with community partners such as the Petes and Peterborough Public Health. Highlights included that last year we raised over \$6,000.00 for the Hospital for Sick Children and how this year Public Health gave us \$1,500.00 to help support the work of this year's OPHEA committee at the school. Dr. LeClerc said she plans to tweet the video to staff across the KPR system once it is ready.

Unfortunately ETFO (the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario) and the Ontario Government have not yet finalized a new contract for our elementary teachers. The teachers as, directed by their union, have been following gradual work to rule to try and minimize impact on students. Last week the work to rule expectations changed and teachers are no longer permitted to take students on Field Trips off the school property. They are also not permitted to organize assemblies although they can attend an assembly to supervise their students. What this means for us at NCPS is that we will not be able to participate in the skating trips or the ski trip that we had planned. We also will not be able to have our Character Education assemblies or attend the basketball tournament unless things change. The fitness club and dance troupes will also have to be put on hold for the time being. If the union and the government reach an agreement, we will consider if we can rebook some of the trips that were missed, but it will depend on timing and venue availability.

In the meantime, we do have some fun things planned for our students this month. On Wednesday, January 15th at 2:00 p.m. we have a show in the Gym for JK-Gr. 4 called 'The Berenstain Bears'. On Wednesday, January 22nd, all students JK-Gr. 6 will enjoy an 'Outdoor Education' opportunity in our own school yard with Nancy Thompson a local outdoor educator. If there is enough snow, they will get to try using

snow shoes! On January 29th Janet Hughes will be coming with her special service dog to teach about kindness and empathy caring for animals as well as for each other. All classes will have a visit from Janet. In addition, Mr. Woollacott is planning to run a house league (in-school) basketball tournament so the kids still get to play. Mr. Heuvel hopes to do the same with Handball after that. The Grade 6 students will go ahead with being guest servers at Boston Pizza on January 22nd from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. to raise money for their Camp Kawartha Trip which we hope will go ahead by then. If you are thinking about taking the family out for a meal, we encourage you to consider Boston Pizza that evening. All you have to do is sign your receipt NCPS and put it in the plastic bin at the restaurant and 10% comes back to the school.

The kids love the snow so hopefully we will get some more for them to enjoy! I wish everyone health and peace in 2020. Happy New Year!

Winter Weather: Extreme cold: KPR policy is for children to stay inside when it 'feels like' temperatures reach -26 C with wind chill. Given the wide open terrain surrounding the school we usually consider -20 C as the 'too cold' point (depending upon the wind). Please remember to send your child with appropriate warm clothing including boots, hat, mitts and snow-pants. A second pair of mitts is a good idea since the first pair are often wet after first recess.

Snowball throwing and kicking snow at others is not permitted at North Cavan for safety reasons. Students caught throwing snowballs will lose privileges such as recess.




